Landfill Project Recognized

The New Jersey Alliance for Action (NJAA), a Middlesex County-based organization that promotes sound infrastructure investment and capital construction projects, recently recognized one of the MCUA’s engineering consultants for its work at the Middlesex County Landfill.

French & Parrello Associates was featured at NJAA’s third annual Distinguished Engineering Awards Breakfast for successfully designing and overseeing the construction of Cells 7, 8, and 9 at the Landfill.

Robert Leslie, P.E., the MCUA’s Landfill Engi-

neer, attended the presentation on behalf of the Authority and accepted the NJAA’s acknowledgment and certificate.

Among the project’s innovations, is the use of the existing plan and available air space so as to keep the Landfill confined to a smaller area. The new cells also feature a double-composite liner system and a gravity-based leachate transfer system, both of which reduce impacts on the environment. A third component of the work, the installation of a contact storm-water basin, efficiently manages water runoff at the Landfill and ensures it is properly treated.
