



## Freeholder Linda Carter Re-Appointed to MCUA Board



**A**t its January meeting, the MCUA Board of Commissioners congratulated Union County Freeholder Linda Carter on her re-appointment to the Board.

Freeholder Carter brings a unique voice to the Board as its only representative from Union County. The MCUA provides wastewater treatment services to 36 municipalities, including Plainfield, Fanwood, and part of Scotch Plains in Union County. The rest of the 36 municipalities are in Middlesex County, with several in neighboring Somerset County.

“Freeholder Carter is an important voice on the Board, given not only her representation of Union County, but

also her years of government experience,” said Ted Light, Chairman of the MCUA Board of Commissioners. “We are grateful for her perspective and counsel on our behalf.”

Freeholder Carter is a lifelong resident of Plainfield where she previously served on the City Council. She was first elected to the Union County Board of Chosen Freeholders in 2010 and has served terms as its Chair and Vice Chair. In addition to her service with the Middlesex County Utilities Authority, Freeholder Carter serves as a commissioner of the Raritan Valley Rail Coalition and has volunteered with the YMCA and Big Brothers, Big Sisters.

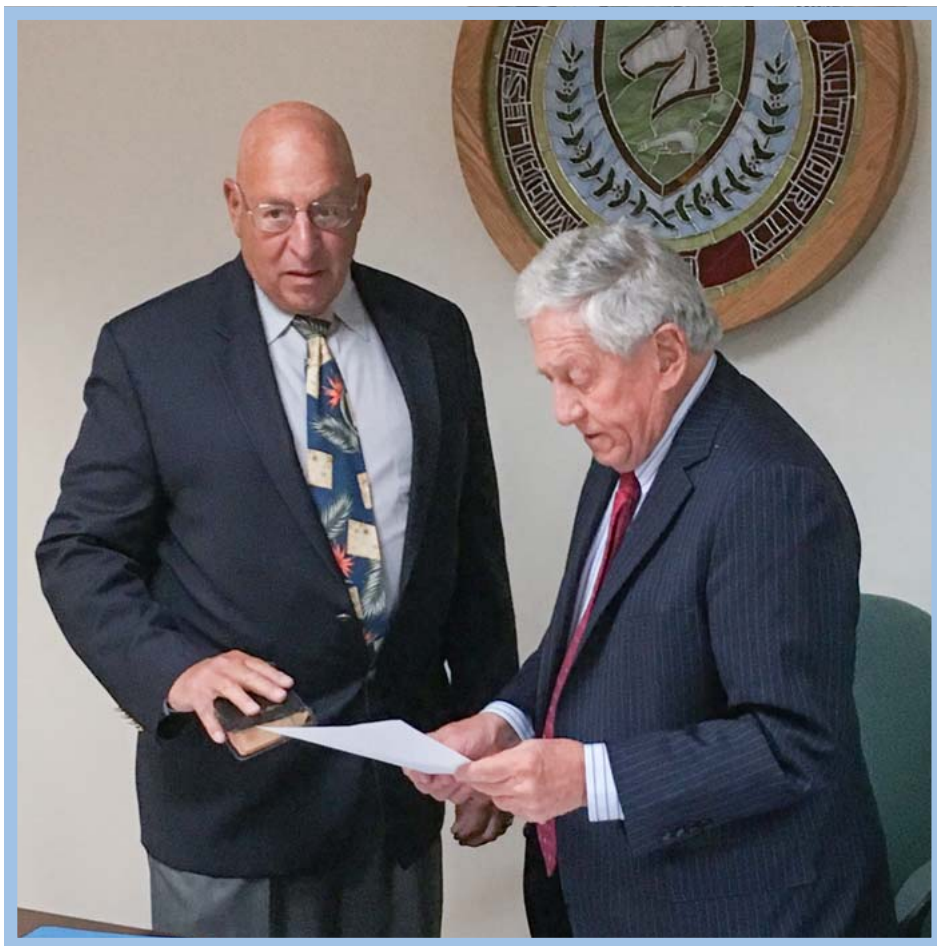
