Dan Tanzi Retires from MCUA

Capping More Than 27 Years of Service

onato Tanzi – or as he is known throughout the MCUA, "Dan" – will retire from the Middlesex County Utilities Authority later this month, capping a 27-year career.

Tanzi first came to the MCUA in 1990 as a Project Superintendent, and was appointed General Superintendent the following year. He became the Wastewater Division Manager in January 1995, a position he has held until his retirement in March 2017.

During Tanzi's tenure, the MCUA – and the Wastewater Division, in particular – significantly expanded its use of innovative technology to increase efficiencies and reduce environmental impacts of the wastewater treatment process. As the Division's Chief Engineer, Tanzi was instrumental in the introduction and regular production of Meadow Life, a natural, organic fertilizer and liming agent made from concentrated biosolids.

More recently, Tanzi worked to bring solar energy to the

Authority, a complement to its existing use of Landfill gas.
